2020 was a year of adaptation and the formation of a stable habit of being effective and persistent in conditions of total uncertainty. ## **HOW THE ASSOCIATION WORKS**




Public Association "Reanimation Package of Reforms Coalition" was officially registered on May 08, 2019. It was founded by the 25 organizations from among the full members of the informal coalition "Reanimation Package of Reforms" – a coalition of NGOs and experts who developed and implemented the necessary

reforms in Ukraine after the 2014 Revolution of Dignity. Currently there are 26 organizational members of the RPR Coalition.



#### **OUR VISION:**

a successful, democratic Ukrainian state with equal rights for everyone and a welldeveloped civil society.



#### STRUCTURE OF THE ASSOCIATION

### The General Meeting of the Association —

the highest governing body. Full members of the Association have the right to vote at the General Meeting. The General Meeting convenes at least once a year. The Meeting is deemed duly constituted provided that it is attended by a majority of full members of the Association. Decisions of the General Meeting are adopted by the majority of participants.

 Approve the strategy and annual reports of the Association:

- Elect the RPR Board:
- Accept new members of the Association:
- Make decisions on changing the Articles of Association and reformatting the Association:
- Set the amount and terms of payment of membership fees.

#### The Board of Association —

the permanent governing body that acts on behalf of the Association. The Board is elected by the General Meeting of nine persons for a term of one year. The composition of the Boards is renewed annually by at least 30%.



- Together with the Executive Director prepares a draft Strategy of the Association.
- Approves the internal documents of the Association and project applications.
- Approves the annual budget and the agenda of the Association.
- Approves the decisions on ethical issues and adherence to the values of the Association.
- Appoints and dismisses the Executive Director of the Association.

The Executive Director of the Association — the head of the Association, who carries out operational management of affairs, property and funds of the Association. The Executive Director is appointed by the Board for a term of two years.

- Carries out operational management and coordinates the Association's activities.
- Together with the Board prepares a draft Strategy of the Association.
- Prepares documents for approval by the Association: annual agenda and budget of the Association, internal policies, annual report.
- Ensures the implementation the functions of advocacy, communication, international relations, regional activities, fundraising and organizational development of the Association.
- Approves the staffing table of the Association, hires and fires employees of the Association.

The Secretariat — the Executive Director and all his subordinates who assist the members of the Association in promotion of the reforms according to agreed priorities. The Secretariat operates in four areas: advocacy (including on the international level), communication and PR, regional departments, and institutional strengthening of the Association.

#### ADVOCACY DIRECTION

8 legislative proposals endorsed by the RPR Coalition were adopted

In the final reading:



Draft Law of Ukraine "On Amendments to the Law of Ukraine "On Local Self-Government in Ukraine" (No.2653) that empowers the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine to determine the administrative centres and territories of communities.



Draft resolution of the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine "On the formation and liquidation of districts" (No.3650).



Draft Law of Ukraine "On Amendments to the Budget Code of Ukraine Concerning Alignment with the Provisions of Budget Legislation in Connection with the Completion of Administrative-Territorial Reform" (No.3614) that quarantees a 60% income tax for the communities.

In the first reading:



Draft Law of Ukraine "On Administrative Procedure" (No.3475) that regulates the relations of executive authorities and local self-government bodies with citizens and businesses on a single and fair basis.



Draft Law of Ukraine "On Waste Management" (No.2207-1-d) that provides a comprehensive pro-European model based on the waste management hierarchy.



Draft Law of Ukraine "On Democracy through an All-Ukrainian Referendum" (No.3612) that legislates the constitutional right to a referendum.



The draft Law of Ukraine "On the Bureau of Economic Security of Ukraine" (No.3087-d) that provides for the establishment of a single law enforcement body responsible for the investigation of economic crimes.



Draft Law of Ukraine "On the Principles of State Anti-Corruption Policy for 2020-2024" (No.4135).

#### Rejected with the support of the RPR Coalition:

The draft Law of Ukraine "On Amendments to Some Laws of Ukraine Concerning the Definition of Entities Covered by Anti-Corruption Legislation" (No.3355-1), which allowed to exclude children who do not live with the subject of declaration from the list of family members.



Two large-scale forums were organized in preparation for the annual International Conference on Reforms in Ukraine — Ukraine Reform Conference 2021, which presented 22 sectoral analytical briefings on reforms in Ukraine.



22 regional discussions of sectoral reforms were held in preparation for the Ukraine Reform Conference.



4 public discussions of the Anti-Corruption Strategy for 2020-2024 were organized.

## REGIONAL COALITIONS



On September 2, 2020, the RPR Coalition launched the Best Practices of Local Governance project to strengthen the advocacy capacity of local and regional civil society organizations in implementing reforms at the local and regional levels by facilitating the exchange of best practices between them. This project is implemented under the USAID/ENGAGE activity, which is funded by the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) and implemented by Pact.

#### **KORSUN REGION COALITION OF PUBLIC ORGANIZATIONS**



Extension of implementation of the project "Social Innovation Camp 'Youth will change Cherkasy Region Che-Inn 2.0!" designed to help young people to develop and implement innovative ways to solve socially important problems.



The "Do not burn - compost" project to increase the eco-culture of utilizing organic garbage and fallen leaves.



Strengthening the capacity of local authorities and civil society to control the road repairs.

#### MYKOLAIV REGIONAL PLATFORM OF REFORMS


