## **RESULTS IN 2022**

#### **ADVOCACY AREA**

With the advocacy support of the RPR Coalition, the Ukrainian parliament adopted 8 draft laws.

#### THE DRAFT LAWS ADOPTED IN THE FIRST READING:

- 1. No. 6287 on stimulating the development of Ukrainian book publishing and book management
- 2. No. 7283 on democracy in communities

#### THE DRAFT LAWS ADOPTED IN THE SECOND READING:

- 1. No. 4358 on the protection of public health from the harmful effects of tobacco
- 2. No. 3475 on administrative procedure
- 3. No. 6104 on support for Ukrainian prisoners
- 4. No. 6302 on clarifying the tasks and foundations for the preparation and conduct of national resistance
- 5. No. 7459 on amendments to certain laws of Ukraine regarding restrictions on the import and distribution of publishing products related to the aggressor state, the Republic of Belarus, and the temporarily occupied territory of Ukraine
- 6. No. 7273-d on amendments to certain laws of Ukraine regarding the support of the national music product and restrictions on the public use of the music product of the aggressor state
- 7. No. 4142 on the Public Health System

# **RESULTS OF 2022**

#### **REGIONAL AREA**

In addition to advocating for reforms at the national level, the RPR Coalition develops and supports the activities of advocacy coalitions - regional partners of the RPR. In 2022, the RPR coalitions radically changed the focus of their work and were able to reorganise their activities to include active participation in volunteering.

REGIONAL PARTNERS

- In 2022, the Rivne Reforms Council, represented by the Civil Network OPORA in Rivne, organised a medical volunteer headquarters in Rivne, facilitated the work of shelters, and conducted an analytical study of the impact of martial law on the functioning of communities in Rivne region.
- At the beginning of 2022, the Lviv Regulatory Hub and the Lviv Regional
  Military Administration established a Coordination Centre for collecting aid
  and funds for the Armed Forces, the TOT and internally displaced persons.
  The LRC managed to purchase the necessary goods to meet the needs of the
  security forces and civilians for more than UAH 12 million, and, with the
  support of partners and the international community, attracted and
  transferred more than 95 tonnes of humanitarian aid to 15 regions of the
  country.
- One of the most important projects completed in 2022 by the NGO "ZHAR", a
  partner of the RPR Coalition in Khmelnytskyi Oblast, was the research and
  preparation of the transparency rating of municipal enterprises in
  Khmelnytskyi and Ternopil regions.
- Since the beginning of the full-scale invasion, the Mykolaiv Regional Coalition team of the RPR launched a humanitarian hub and transferred humanitarian aid to the evacuation points.
- The Sumy Reforms Platform, a partner of the RPR Coalition, actively advocated for the local council's decision in the process of de-Russification of public namings in the city of Sumy. Eventually, the decision was adopted.

## **EVENTS OF 2022**

On 28-29 April, the RPR Coalition co-organised a panel discussion <u>"Ukraine's Recovery Strategy. Vision from Ukraine and International Partners"</u> within the framework of the conference "After the War. Rethinking the Future of Civil Society".

Among the participants of the event: Yulia Svyrydenko, First Vice Prime Minister and Minister of Economy, Vitaliy Bezgin, Chairman of the Subcommittee on Administrative and Territorial Structure of the Verkhovna Rada Committee on State Building, Local Self-Government, Regional Development and Urban Planning, Katarina Mathernova, Deputy Directorate General for Neighbourhood and Enlargement Policy of the European Commission.

On 31 May, the RPR Coalition in partnership with the European Council on Foreign Relations organised a joint non-public discussion with the Vice Prime Minister of Ukraine Olha Stefanishyna on "Ukraine as an EU candidate: opportunities and challenges".

Among the participants of the event were representatives of the governments of EU member states (Ministry of Armed Forces of France, Ministry of European and Foreign Affairs of France, Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Slovakia, etc.) and EU think tanks (Institute for European Union Security Studies, Polish Institute of International Relations, etc.)



### **EVENTS OF 2022**

On 17 June, the RPR Coalition and the International Institute for Democracy and Electoral Assistance (International IDEA) organised an online event "Democratic reforms for Ukraine's integration into the EU: dialogue with leading reformers".

On 4 July, the RPR Coalition co-organised a side even "Paving the way for a successful and inclusive process of Ukraine's recovery" at the Ukraine Recovery Conference 2022 (URC) held in Lugano, Switzerland. The event was attended by ambassadors, representatives of the Government of Ukraine and the Verkhovna Rada.

# UKRAINIAN RECOVERY CONFERENCE

As part of the <u>Ukraine Recovery Conference 2022</u> in Lugano, our experts developed Recommendations for the National Recovery Plan of Ukraine. The recommendations of civil society experts are summarised below:

- Ensure justice through comprehensive judicial reform.
- Improve the system of prosecutors and criminal justice agencies.
  - Modernise the security and defence sectors in line with NATO standards.
  - Protect the interests of public broadcasting in the information policy.
    - Increase Ukraine's recognition in the world through the development of Ukrainian culture.
- Intensify the policy of improving the business climate and reforming the tax system to reflect current economic realities. In ease the organisation and cooperation of the state authorities in the field of formulating Ukraine's development policy and its legal regulation.
  - Complete the decentralisation reform.
  - Continue anti-corruption reform, develop and maintain anticorruption infrastructure.
  - Reform the humanitarian sector with a focus on protecting the rights and state support of veterans, reforming the healthcare, education and social policy systems.



# ENTRANCE EXAM<br/>FOR UKRAINE

On December 9, the RPR Coalition organized a roundtable discussion of the study <u>"Entrance</u> Exam for Ukraine: What We Have to Do to <u>Implement the EU Recommendations"</u>.
